Planning your *new bathroom*

Every successful bathroom installation starts with good planning.

Before selecting products or arranging installation dates, consider the following:

Your Requirements - Ask yourself:

- Who will be using the bathroom?
- Is it a family bathroom, en-suite or cloakroom?
- Do you require accessibility features?
- Would a bath, shower or both best suit your needs?

Setting a Budget

Establishing a budget early helps avoid unexpected costs later. An average standard bathroom will need a budget of £10-15,000.

Remember, you will need to allow for:

- Bathroom suite , fittings & installers
- Plumbing work
- Electrical work
- Tiling and flooring
- Decoration
- Contingency funds for unforeseen issues

We recommend setting aside approximately 10-15% of your budget for unexpected costs that may arise during installation.

Measuring the *space*

Accurate measurements are essential.

Consider:

- Room dimensions
- Door positions
- Window locations
- Existing pipework & soil stacks
- Ceiling height
- Available storage areas

Accurate measurements can help prevent costly mistakes and ensure products fit correctly. There's a grid at the end of this guide for you to make an initial drawing. Alongside this, take lots of photos of your 'before' bathroom.

Designing *your bathroom*

A well-designed bathroom should combine practicality, comfort and style.

Layout considerations

Think carefully about:

- Toilet positioning
- Basin location
- Bath or shower placement
- Access routes
- Storage requirements including furniture

A well-planned layout improves usability while making the most of available space.

Lighting

Good lighting can transform a bathroom. Consider:

- Ceiling lighting
- Mirror lighting
- Feature lighting
- Natural daylight

All electrical installations must comply with current safety regulations.

Ventilation

Proper ventilation helps prevent:

- Condensation
- Damp
- Mould growth
- Damage to decorations and furnishings

Extractor fans are often essential for maintaining a healthy bathroom environment.

Plumbing & heating *considerations*

Before installation begins, you should assess the existing services to ensure they are suitable for the works you want doing.

This includes:

- Water pressure checks so your new taps work properly
- Pipework condition
- Drainage arrangements to allow sufficient fall from the shower, bath & basin
- Boiler performance to create enough heat & hot water for the bathroom
- Heating requirements

Additional work may be required if fixtures are being relocated or upgraded.

Walls, floors & finishing touches

The finishing materials you choose will have a major impact on the overall appearance of your bathroom.

Wall Finishes

Options include:

- Ceramic tiles
- Porcelain tiles
- Decorative wall panels / aquapanel
- Moisture-resistant paint

Flooring

Popular choices include:

- Tiles
- Luxury vinyl flooring
- Waterproof laminate flooring

Always select slip-resistant materials where possible.

Bathroom *Storage Solutions*

Storage is one of the most overlooked parts of a bathroom design. Get it right and your space stays calm, tidy and easy to live with. Get it wrong and you'll be fighting clutter every single day. Here are some ideas worth considering.

1. Use alcoves and recesses

If your bathroom has alcoves, make the most of them with built-in shelves or cabinets. Recessed shelving in stud walls (especially around concealed cisterns) uses space that would otherwise go to waste.

2. Think above and below the basin

Wall-hung vanity units free up floor space and make the room feel bigger. Add a mirrored cabinet above for double the storage without extra footprint.

3. Raise the bath

Lifting your bath a few inches allows shallow drawers underneath – perfect for toilet rolls, cleaning products or children's bath toys. Hidden but close to hand.

4. Use vertical space

Tall, slim shelving units slot beside a basin or shower and take up minimal floor space. Floating shelves keep towels and toiletries accessible without cluttering surfaces.

5. Repurpose furniture

Vintage cabinets, bookcases and even kitchen trolleys can be repurposed as bathroom storage. A freestanding unit gives flexibility and character.

6. Baskets and trays

Wicker baskets are affordable, look good and come in all sizes. A bath tray keeps essentials tidy and doubles as a relaxation spot for candles or a book.

7. Use the back of doors

Hooks, wire baskets or magnetic strips on the inside of cabinet doors create extra space for hair dryers, cleaning supplies or small tools like tweezers and nail clippers.

8. Sloped ceilings and awkward spaces

False walls with push-latch doors can turn dead space behind sloped ceilings into useful cupboards. Tambour doors work well where there isn't room for a hinged door to swing open.

Mrs Christy's Personal Recommendations

Do try and put a lot of thought into designing a room that you will be in a lot – and make sure you fill it with items you will love looking at. Many customers favour grey tones currently, but I would recommend showing a bit of personality with a pop of colour. Make it easy to clean and if you want a big basin – get a big basin ! Love it – do not settle.

It's tempting to go for cheap materials for your bathroom because of budget, but that bathroom may look like it's from a magazine shoot for a few months – give it a year and it will look cheap. Edges will fray, the grout will look yellow and leaks will appear. The other temptation is to commission cheap labour, where builders or handymen who say they can fit bathrooms do not prepare the room fully and they cut corners. They then bodge the job in with wonky worktops, plastic pipe, no access to taps or toilet parts for future maintenance, and poor finishes.

So my advice? Get long-lasting, good quality materials and installers who care about the room from the bones up and who allow for easy access for future maintenance issues.

A realistic budget

How much does a new bathroom cost in 2026?

A renovation can transform your bathroom into a modern, luxurious space and may add value to your property. But home improvement projects can be expensive, so it helps to set a realistic budget before you start. Here are average costs from the Building Cost Information Service (BCIS) for 2025.

Average New Bathroom Costs (2025)

Terraced house (approx. 3.5 m²): £6,640 – £12,100

Semi-detached (approx. 4 m²): £7,230 – £13,150

Detached house (approx. 6.5 m²): £11,350 – £20,650

These prices include removing the existing bathroom, installing new units (bath, basin, WC, vanity unit), fittings, flooring, wall tiling and decoration.

What Affects the Cost?

- Where you live
- Age and condition of your property
- Ease of access to plumbing
- How long the job takes
- Quality of fittings and fixtures
- Whether the fitter is disposing of waste
- Whether additional specialists (tilers, electricians) are needed

Tips to Save Money

- Find your own fitter rather than using the retailer's installer
- Consider a refresh (painting, regrouting, new taps) before a full renovation
- Avoid moving plumbing or waste pipes if possible – this adds significant cost
- Install water-efficient products (shower timers, dual flush) for long-term savings

Can a Bathroom Add Value to Your Property?

A new bathroom could boost your property value by 2-5%. Adding an extra bathroom, en suite or downstairs loo could add 3-7%. For best resale value, opt for light, timeless finishes and ensure a healthy ratio of bathrooms to bedrooms. Experts advise against replacing the only bathtub with a walk-in shower – it can put off buyers with young families.

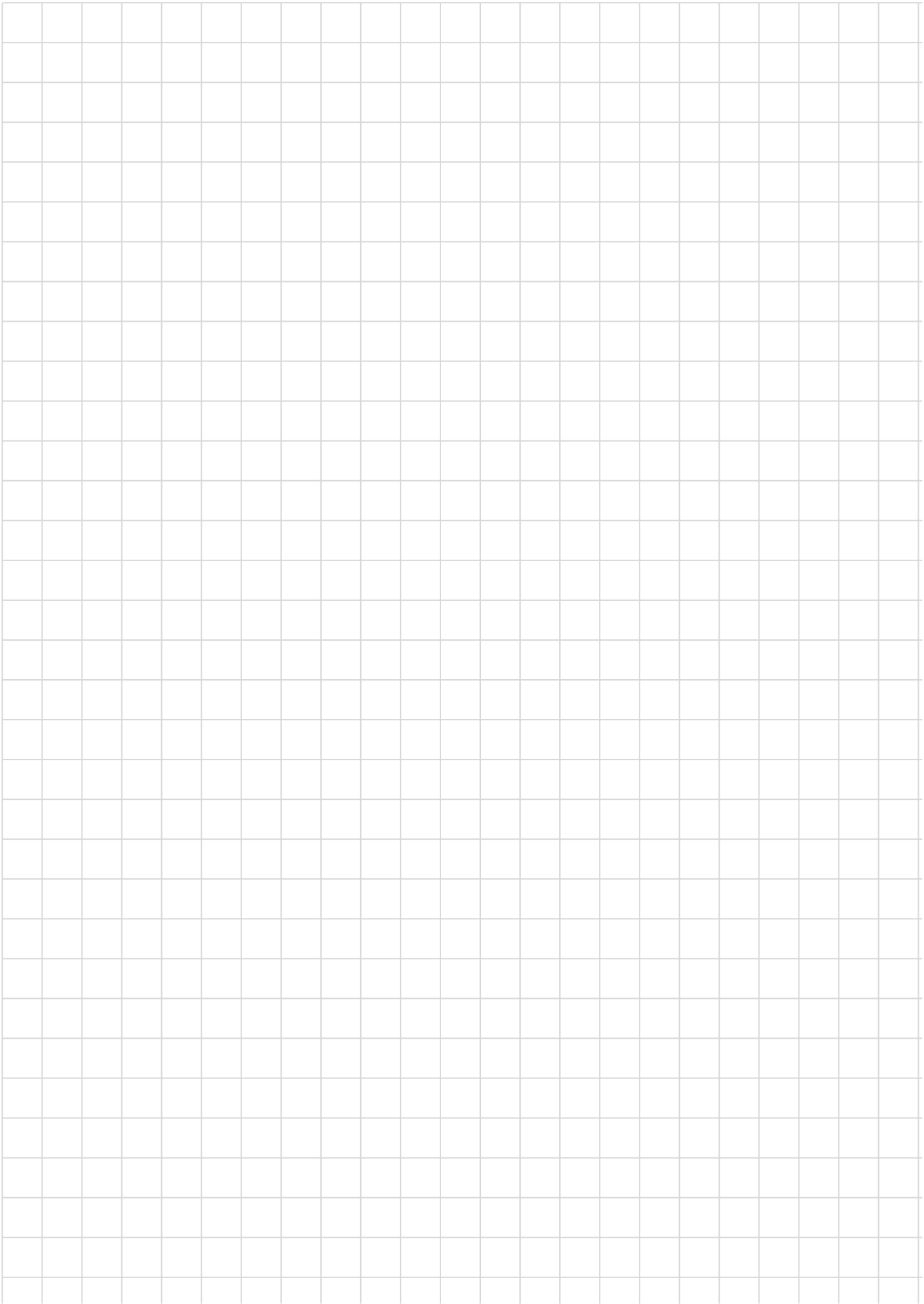
